Theatre Under the Stars is looking for enthusiastic and committed volunteers interested in working as backstage volunteers (running crew, props and costume assistants). This is a great opportunity to gain practical hands on experience as well as volunteer hours.

Responsibilities:

Backstage Volunteers responsibilities are, but not limited to:

- Backstage Crew: Bring the set pieces on and off stage. Some heavy lifting may be required.
- Lighting: Operate the follow spot. Working with the stage manager you will help make sure that the performers are always in their light. Must be okay with heights.
- Sound: Help operate the sound board and help performers get their microphones on and set up.
- Costumes: Working with the costume designer help the performers get their costumes and makeup looking great before every performance. During the show, help performers make those quick changes super quick.
- Props: Working with the stage managers make sure that all of the objects the performers use during the show.

Requirements:

- · Some positions may require heavy lifting or climbing heights
- Supply your own "blacks" (black shirt, pants and shoes. That way you blend into the dark stage.)
- · Have a positive attitude and a desire to learn something new.

Expectations:

- Plan to be at every performance of the show. If you have any conflicts let us know and we can try
 to accommodate. An important part of making a show go off without a hitch is having the same crew all
 the time
- · Be available for the tech days.
